Assessment information

The assessment in this workbook meets all the requirements of the accredited course *52891WA – Course in Early Career Discovery* which includes the unit of competency *ECDUCD001 Undertake early career discovery*.

You can only undertake the assessment following completion of the *Course in Early Career Discovery*, delivered by a qualified person. You must have completed the learning content and activities in the *Your Career Passport*, which addresses the unit of competency requirements. If you are unsure if this has occurred, please confirm with your teacher or career practitioner.

To demonstrate competency in this course, you must undertake all assessments and have them deemed Satisfactory (S) by the assessor.

If you do not complete the tasks to a satisfactory level, you will be deemed Not Yet Satisfactory (NYS). The assessor may ask you for more evidence to determine your competency. If any of your tasks are deemed Not Yet Satisfactory, your assessor will provide you with information about how you can resubmit the assessment.

Once you have demonstrated the required level of performance and been deemed Satisfactory in all of the tasks, you will be deemed Competent (C) in the course and issued a certificate to show your achievement.

Before commencing the assessment, your teacher/trainer will explain each task and how to complete and submit it.

- a computer with Microsoft Office installed;

Assessment – Develop Career Pathway Report

Student instructions

For this assessment you will need to create a Career Pathway Report. This report can be a:

- **short oral presentation** presented face to face or recorded, and consider preparing some presentation notes;
- **simple media presentation** such as PowerPoint, Canva or other visual format; or
- **written document** using the template on the next page, or create your own document or list.

Ask your assessor for further information if you are unsure about how to present your report.

The report must include:

1. Your career aspirations
2. Your career values
3. Your career strengths
4. Your career interests
5. Your work preferences and conditions
6. Your study preferences
7. Emerging and contemporary industries and their occupations
8. Industries and/or occupations that you are interested in as a career
9. Skills required for the industries/occupations
10. Other occupations with similar skills (eg job cluster transferable skills)
11. Study and training pathways for the occupation you are interested in (at least two)
12. Career role models/mentors and people who can provide information and advice (at least two)
13. Resources and tools used to motivate you and help plan your career pathway (at least two)
14. Career taster and career development activities you would like to complete

You may use the information in *Your Career Passport*, myfuture and Jobs and Skills WA websites, or any other career resources, to assist with the assessment requirements.

What to submit

- A print out of your myfuture My Career Profile results.
- Evidence of a Career Pathway Report. The evidence will vary depending on how the report is delivered (for example, template completed, list, own report, presentation notes).
