




Education and training election commitments across the student journey

The WA Jobs Plan outlined several key initiatives aimed at strengthening the vocational education pathways and career development in schools. These election commitments are being delivered by the **Department of Education** and the **Department of Training and Workforce Development**, providing support throughout a student's secondary schooling. This visual diagram demonstrates the education and training election commitments for secondary students and their parents and schools.

Career resources to support parents

- » Career practitioners will complete a Graduate Certificate in Career Development Practice
- » Will build strong career development culture in schools

Support for school-based apprentices and trainees

- » Financial assistance to support school-based apprentices and trainees to complete training
- » Covers costs for transport, food, clothing, personal protective equipment, educational and practical supports

Professional learning for VET teachers in schools

- » Up to two weeks industry placement for VET teachers/ trainers
- » Up to four weeks for schoolbased VET teachers/trainers delivering under an RTO auspiced arrangement

Expanded VET delivered to secondary students places

» VET qualifications delivered in secondary schools expanded to an additional 4,000 places by 2024
